

TRAVEL REQUIREMENTS FOR INDIA

Passport and Documents

Current Original passport with a minimum validity of six months from the date of commencement of Travel.
The passport must have at least 2 blank pages.

Visa Requirements

If you are a national of any following countries, you are eligible for eVisa.

Health Risks and Requirements

Most of the countries do not require any kind of Vaccination, however some specific countries or passport holders or travelling from specific countries required Vaccinations

Consult your doctor about necessary vaccinations for India, which may include yellow fever, Polio hepatitis A, typhoid, and tetanus.

Medication

Consult your doctor:

Before traveling, always consult your doctor to discuss necessary vaccinations and medications based on your health and travel itinerary.

Prescription medications:

Bring all your prescription medications with you in their original packaging, accompanied by a doctor's prescription in English.

Malaria prevention:

Depending on the region you're visiting, consider taking malaria prevention medication as prescribed by your doctor.

Important considerations:

- **Check local regulations:**
Be aware of any local regulations regarding the import of specific medications into India.
- **Declare medications at customs:**
When entering India, be prepared to declare any medications you are carrying at customs.
- **Access to healthcare:**
While pharmacies are readily available in India, it's important to be aware that accessing quality healthcare might be different than what you are accustomed to.

Travel Insurance

It is essential to have a travel insurance policy to cover theft, loss and medical problems. Some companies offer a range of medical expense options, but the small print must be scrutinized. It is preferable to have a policy that pays doctors or hospitals directly rather than you having to pay on the spot and claim later. Check that the policy covers ambulances and emergency flights home. Numerous policies also specify exclusion of dangerous activities such as scuba diving, renting a local motorbike and even trekking. Take note that locally acquired motorbikes are not valid under certain policies.

CURRENCY:

The currency is Indian Rupees (INR).

Notes: INR 10, 20, 50, 100 and 500

Coins: INR 1, 2 and 5, 10, 20

Credit cards: All major credit cards are widely accepted in cities, but use may be American Express restricted in small shops or restaurant.

BUSINESS:

Shops are generally open between the following hours:

Hours 09h00/10h00 - 19h00/20h30

CLIMATE IN DELHI:

September is hot and relatively dry in Delhi, with moderate weather.

CLOTHING:

In the summer months (August), wear light cotton and casuals. A very light hat and sunglasses are recommended for protection against the hot sun. Sun Block and Suntan lotion is also a recommended.

TIPS:

Service is generally included in your bills. However, it is acceptable to leave a small amount should you feel you have received exceptional service in bars, restaurants, hotels and taxis.

TIME:

India has only one time zone. *IST is ahead of GMT by 5:30 Hours. In this article, we will examine the differences between the GMT (Greenwich Mean Time) and IST (Indian Standard Time).

ELECTRICITY:

In India, power plugs and sockets (outlets) of type C, type D and type M are used. The standard voltage is 230 V at a frequency of 50 Hz. Yes, you need a power plug travel adapter for sockets type C, D and M in India.
